Myth: Searching and applying for scholarships is too much work




Searching for scholarships is the easier part while applying can take more time. Many resources exist to help you.



Types of Scholarships





National

Scholarships available to students across the country.

Examples: - Coca-Cola Scholars - Jack Kent Cooke

Community

Scholarships specific to Georgia or Atlanta.

Parental Organization

Scholarships tied to your parent(s)'s characteristics or involvement.

Examples: - Achieve Atlanta - Posse - Greenhouse Scholars Examples: - Marine Corps - Wal-Mart Associate Scholarship - National Center for Parents with Disabilities

Types of Scholarships



Students' Organizations

Scholarships tied to your own characteristics or involvement.

Examples:

- Big Brother Big Sister
- National Honor Society
- Humanity Rising Service



Intended School

or Department

Scholarships designated to a specific academic department or university.

Examples: - Blacks at Microsoft - Carlos Endowed Scholarship at Georgia State - Dean's Scholarships at Clark Atlanta
